In the Netherlands gifts are exchanged and parties organised on the 5<sup>th</sup> of December, the eve of his official saint's day. There are lots of wonderful stories of him. One in which he throws three bags of money through a window at night to save three poor girls from prostitution. The one thing we know for sure about St. Nicholas is that he was bishop of Myra (Lycia in Modern Turkey) in the early 4<sup>th</sup> century.

Many colourful stories and traditions are added through the centuries. Dutch settlers in North America creatively combined the traditions around St. Nicholas with Nordic folklore. He becomes intertwined with a magician who punishes naughty children and rewards obedient children. Santa Claus (English pronunciation of the Dutch for St. Nicholas – Sinterklaas) becomes dislocated from his Christian roots and exchanges his mitre for a different pointy hat.

St. Nicholas followed the Christ child in his generous and abundant giving. At Christmas we celebrate God's generous and abundant giving of himself to us. Santa Clause enacts that same generosity. Whether we see in Santa Clause a Christian saint or a pagan magician, I hope that his generosity may inspire us all this season.

## Reflection

#### Homeless

In the holiday we went to a talk at the National Theatre about different kinds of plot lines in stories. One of my favourite plot lines is "The Journey": there and back again. In literature we have the classic example of Homer's epic poem the *Odyssey*, in which Odysseus takes ten years to travel home and has many adventures on the way. We might all have our favourite of these journey stories: Tolkien's *Lord of the Rings* or maybe the very recent *The Salt Path* by Raynor Winn. These stories appeal to a desire to be somewhere else; to walk; to change; to have adventures.

The hero who is on the journey is of course homeless, whether there is ultimately a home or not, during the travels there is none. Raynor Winn describes how people change their attitude when they find out that she does not have a home. With a home to go back to, people view her journey as heroic; without a home the journey is often seen as tragic.

But isn't the point of being "on the road" that the protagonist is *not* at home, is homeless? The Bible is also full of journeys. At this time of year we especially think of the journeys of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem and then later to Egypt. Jesus is born in a stable because his parents are *not* at home. When, at Christmas, we hear this story again I wonder to what extent it might help us on our journey through life to *not* be at home? Which journeys have you taken in life? Has it helped you at any time to *not* feel at home?

#### **Odstock Manor**

The original Manor House in Odstock was probably built in 1567. It was a very much larger house than the present Manor House, consisting of three wings in a U shape. The current Manor House is the only wing remaining, those to the west and east having been pulled down when the Manor was bought by the Earl of Radnor at the end of the eighteenth century. At this time the Manor was made into a farmhouse with 1200 acres attached, including the glebe land which Lord Radnor rented from the Vicar to add to the farm.

Separate from the house was a very large barn at one end of which was a private chapel used by the Roman Catholic Webb family who had their own priest to minister to the family and to their largely Catholic household.

During the civil wars in the time of Charles 1, the Webbs were utterly loyal to the king and in 1644 were created Baronets by Charles II. However, being a Roman Catholic in England after this time became very risky and often made life extremely difficult for the family whose life was watched carefully and whose movements were monitored in detail. Families like the Webbs usually sent their children to Roman Catholic Europe to be educated. The Manor had a very large kitchen garden surrounded by a thatched wall. Today the Manor and its beautiful gardens are owned by Lord and Lady Marland.

A new book has recently been published called The Webbs of Odstock by Hugh Wright and it gives a fascinating insight into the Webb family and the very real dangers of being Roman Catholic in England, especially after the Gunpowder Plot in the time of Elizabeth 1st. HD 2019.

### Christmas Cake Recipe!!!

Baking Ingredients and two bottles of good wine

Sample the wine to check quality. Take a large bowl, check the wine again. To be sure it is of the highest quality, pour one level cup and drink. Repeat. Turn on the electric mixer.

Beat one cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add one teaspoon of sugar. Beat again. At this point it's best to make sure the wine is still OK. Try another cup... Just in case. Turn off the mixerer thingy. Break two eggs and add to the bowl and chuck in the cup of dried fruit.

Pick the sticky fruit up off floor. Mix on the turner. If the fried druit gets stuck in the beaterers just pry it loose with a drewscriver. Sample the wine to check for tonsisticity.

Next, sift two cups of salt, or something. Check the wine. Now shift the lemon juice and strain your nuts. Add one table. Add a sugar spoon, or somefink. Whatever you can find.

Greash the oven. Turn the cake tin 360 degrees and try not to fall over. Don't forget to beat off the turner. Finally, throw the bowl through the window. Finish the wine and wipe counter with the cat.

The Webb family of Odstock, has been described as among the richest Commoner families of England. Eventually they owned property throughout the country, often as a result of marriage into other Catholic families. They originated in Poole and first became wealthy in Salisbury. Their story has often been overlooked. The story of the Webbs finishes after Catholic Emancipation and provides an unusually detailed insight into what was the effect of their Catholic faith on a colourful and devoted family from the split of Henry VIII from Rome until the comparative calm of the Victorian era.
