Welcome to News and Notes for February

St Valentine

It is wonderful to see how much is going on in our villages. This month is no exception. February is the month of St Valentine. It is one of the church's saint days that has caught the imagination of our society, and is widely celebrated.

Interestingly we know very little about St Valentine. We think he was martyred around 270 by Claudius II maybe for marrying Christian couples (this was a time when in Rome it was dangerous to be Christian). But already in 496 Pope Gelasius 1 claims about St Valentine that he and his acts are "being known only to God". Before Chaucer wrote his poem about St Valentine around 1375 we have no record of romantic celebrations though. So the link between St Valentine and courtly love might well have been invented by Chaucer who wrote:

"For this was sent on Seynt Valentyne's day
Whan every foul cometh ther to choose his mate."

It does not matter really whether we have many or few stories about Valentine himself, because the celebration of love is a wonderful Christian thing to do.

The Bible has a whole book dedicated to it which starts with: "Let him kiss me with the kisses of his mouth" and continues "Ah, you are beautiful, my love...". It does also warn us "...do not stir up or awaken love until it is ready!" (Song of Songs 1:1, 15; 2: 7)

Enjoy February, with all it brings in our villages and enjoy celebrating St Valentine. *Reverend Anna-Claar Thomasson-Rosingh*

PUTTING OUR COMMUNITY ONLINE

Village Facebook site - "Five Villages South of Salisbury – BBCON"



Alan Pollard who lives in Odstock, is an experienced retired defence IT professional and recent President of the British Computer Society. He is keen to setup a village facebook page and would greatly appreciate comments or help from within our community. I fully support this scheme and encourage you to get involved.

News and Notes continues to be an excellent vehicle for sharing information around our local community. As well as being a public "notice board" for events, services and updates it also has useful local stories together with the all-important Church notices and communications.

Society these days is increasingly going digital and, whether we like it or not, before long it will become more and more difficult to transact everyday business and access local and government services without being connected to the internet.

Until a couple of years ago our area was not very well served by broadband but this has changed and even faster speeds will evolve over time. Internet communication is now becoming the norm rather than the exception. Over 120 people now receive the News and Notes through their email service and most of the advertisements in the Notes carry an email contact address.

Some of you may recently have experienced an additional online web site called Next Door. This has quite a good pedigree and is aimed at providing a community forum where people can "post" items of information, updates, adverts and small sales. However, experience so far has proved that the area of coverage is too large and people are getting overloaded with messages from outside our community. There are also some data protection and privacy issues associated with the site that are not to everyone's taste. For instance, one of the mechanisms the site uses to expand its coverage is to make it possible to send a postcard invitation to a neighbour. However, the method of selecting the neighbour is based on clicking a potential member house or houses depicted by a "dot" on a local map. The software generates the actual address of the "dot". There is no check as to whether this is necessarily a friend or acquaintance of the inviter. Some unsolicited postcards have been received in this way in our area. **Our advice is that you should beware of such postcard approaches.**

A proposal has been made to set up a more-focussed online "notice board" using a facility in Facebook (FB) called Groups. There is

already a well-used FB Group called Chalke Valley Families and it has proved useful for sharing information and items of interest that cannot wait for the next edition of a local newsletter. Up to the minute alerts for lost animals, suspicious persons and vehicles, and traffic incidents can very quickly be shared and have delivered results. Similarly local "wants" and offers can be circulated.

Alan Pollard at Old Stable House in Odstock has volunteered to set up and administer a similar FB Group just for our News and Notes area. The working title for the Group is "Five Villages South of Salisbury – BBCON" – (Britford, Bodenham, Charlton All Saints, Odstock and Nunton). Well aware that FB has a bad press as a pernicious example of social media, it is very easy to restrict who can contribute to a group and who can see the information online. By making the group 'Closed', only people who can meet local residential criteria or who have a clear connection to our villages, will be accepted. For anyone worried or cautious about venturing into social media like this, Alan can advise how to ensure complete privacy and protection for personal information by careful manipulation of FB account settings. If the group is to take off it will, of course, require each user to have a FB account. Alan can help and advise about setting this up if you are not already on FB. Despite the bad press it is perfectly possible to make use of FB without giving away personal information or being swamped with trivia and unpleasant items.

Alan intends to send out an email to all those who have currently registered an address with News and Notes and all recipients of the paper copy of News and Notes are also invited to get in touch with Alan to indicate their support or otherwise for this venture. News and Notes fully supports this proposal and believes it will be a valuable addition to our community and a useful supplement to the paper newsletter.



A Reflection: Respect in diversity and Peace in division

In my reflections in News and Notes I have been trying to write about “non-religious” spirituality. Creativity, community, our relationship with nature, values and virtues are all aspects of day-to-day spirituality. The aspect of spirituality that has been so far notable by its absence is opinion - ideas, views or faith-content. Political, ethical, philosophical and religious ideas also belong to our spirituality. Whether it is conviction about the ‘how’ of presence or absence of God in the world, or about how we should organise our life together as a society: all our convictions colour our spirituality and impact on each other.

Generally our ideas tend to be very diverse. Diversity is something to be celebrated and enjoyed. It is within this diversity and in the listening to other ideas and respect for other's opinions that wisdom is found.

In recent years we have also experienced real divisions. Some of our political differences have been set up in oppositional terms, with black and white choices over very complex matters. People who are really rather like-minded have ended up on different sides of a divide. It is broadly accepted that our philosophical and political convictions do not come in black and white but in millions of different hues of colour. When our differences harden into divisions it is important to keep connections open; to travel the road from division to diversity. There always remain things we do share.

Let us seek respect and wisdom in diversity and peace where divisions arise both in our local communities and in our life as a nation.




