On the Lower Road in Britford we have a lovely old building called 'The Shelter Barn', it is now a house and was lovingly restored by a local craftsman in the late 80's. The name is evocative, reminiscent of Thomas Hardy and 'Far from the Madding Crowd' and the hardships which we forget about when we romanticise the past - think "no washing machines"! It is in fact part of two barns with the Shelter Barn having literally been an open sided shelter alongside the road where vulnerable and young animals were gathered before they were taken into the 'Main Manor Barn' for winter shelter. You could easily miss the Main Manor Barn if you drive through in the wrong direction, because it is down the side from the 'Shelter Barn' and is now another home, but originally it was also where carts and wagons were stored. It also held the threshing machine room or engine that ran the huge threshing machine outside in the farm yard, as well as being used as stables and byres.

There is a small stream which runs along the back of all the houses in that stretch of Lower Road, which should properly be called a water carrier as it was man made, but it supplies endless delight, with the sinuous sights and sounds of water and the life that it attracts.

The Shelter Barn is nestled opposite the village green and what looks to be the village pond, with this stream running in its back garden. Unfortunately, the Main Manor Barn burned down in 1999 and some of the longstanding residents remember standing outside in their pyjamas at 10 pm on a December night and watching while 10 fire engines tried and failed to save it. I feel for the then owners who lost everything in that fire! Luckily, due to expert work by the Fire Brigade the Shelter Barn escaped. So not quite the original, but still thatched and beautiful!

Now I need some stories of other villages, to even out the scene. Please anyone who has a story or a myth to tell me get in touch, these memories may be dying out as we lose an older generation and it would be good to know more.



CRESS TRIP to UGANDA 3 – 15 September 2019

The 10th Anniversary CRESS trip to the South Sudanese Refugees in Northern Uganda departs on 3rd September. From the Chalke Valley are Caroline Lamb on her 20th visit; Jeremy Metcalfe (2nd visit) and Fiona Sheldon (4th visit). They will be joined by five others, all of whom have been to Africa either independently or with CRESS.

The team will be meeting all the 62 sponsored school children and 18 university and diploma students on a family day and celebration of 10 years of CRESS educational support. The team will also visit the South Sudanese Refugees, the various agriculture projects and the CRESS Clinic.

They will be conducting trauma training, assisting in the CRESS office organisation as well as running a two-day conference on handling stress and bringing children up in a Christian family.

What can you do to support the team ? Three Ps: Prayer, Pounds and Pants

Pray for the team – using the itinerary for daily guidance.

- Provide **pounds** sterling for the team to purchase solar chargers £15, basic phones for students £10, and other products to make life more bearable in a refugee camp.
- Present us with ladies mainly cotton under**pants** as these are in very short supply (mostly small and medium).
- **Packaged new pants** can be dropped off at Knighton Manor, Broad Chalke or Green Pastures in Bodenham, SP5 4EX.

Pounds can be given in cash at the above addresses or online at CRESS, Sort Code 40-12-18; Account: 71407090; Reference: Trip Sept 19

Please donate in cash or kind by 20th August as we have to be sure we will be able to pack everything within the maximum allowed charity weight limits

Extra - News and Notes

Wildflower areas bloom as Salisbury City Council work to increase biodiversity

Salisbury City Council's Parks department are working to increase biodiversity in the City, with several wildflower areas thriving in the summer weather. In 2012, the Parks department followed the success of a wildflower and grass area at Harnham Recreation Ground with the creation of a wildflower drift in Bourne Hill Gardens. Working with Bright Seeds of Swallowcliffe, two mixes of wildflower were chosen – an Old English Meadow mixture and a mix specially designed for shady areas. This project has improved the biodiversity of Bourne Hill, as well as adding interest for insect, butterflies and human visitors alike.

Since then the City Council have rolled out further areas of longer grass and wildflowers including at Queen Elizabeth Gardens, Victoria Park, Churchill Gardens and Hudson's Field. Grass has been left to grow longer in swathes at Harnham and Bemerton Heath, with the chalky down encouraging insects to flourish.

There are additional roadside areas to develop wildlife corridors, such as Newbridge and Skewbridge and wildflower turf has been trialled along the river behind Tesco.

Bishopdown has a large area left as meadow, with paths cut through for dog walkers and those walking to the local school and facilities. The path follows the brow of the hill to Old Sarum – this can be incorporated into circular walks and has lovely views of the city.

On the other side of town, Middle Street Meadow (connected to the city by the Town Path and Broken Bridges) is also to be celebrated for its biodiversity with its pond, rivers and paths cut through the long grass.

There are nature reserves on both sides of the city. The Avon Valley Nature Reserve incorporates the area behind the leisure centre and the boardwalk which takes visitors along the river past reedbeds and into meadows. Lime Kiln Down can be found on Odstock Road on the route to the hospital. Again, the chalk down and re-wilding encourages wildflowers as well as a variety of insects, birds and butterflies.
