The Odstock, Nunton and Bodenham village collection including the Remembrance Service was £1,468.90 which included significant support from New Hall Hospital, The Radnor Arms, The Yew Tree Inn and the Odstock Day nursery, for which we are extremely grateful. I would also like to extend a special thank you to the collectors whose efforts were key in achieving this total.

Money raised through the Poppy Appeal goes directly to the Royal British Legion welfare work which provides through-life care to anyone who is currently serving in the British Armed Forces, who has previously served and to their families. Your kind generosity enables the Legion to continue with this valuable support.

Odstock Parish Council News

The Parish Meeting on Wednesday 12 December was held in the Pavilion in Nunton Field. We were pleased to welcome to the meeting David Canty (the Longford Estate Manager), Edward Gray and Garry Rawlins, who were attending on behalf of the Estate.

Improvements to Nunton Drove Corner

Garry explained the proposed works, which include removal of the existing hedge and bank and levelling of the site, creation of a pond for collection of run-off from the hill, installation of a stone kerb to support the road, erection of fencing around the pond, and planting of a hedgerow along the new field boundary. The aims of this project are to improve visibility for drivers and to reduce water run-off and flooding on the road.

Parish Projects for 2019

We spent some time planning our work programme for the coming year. The following schemes were identified as potential priorities:

- Replacement/restoration of the Nunton playground fence
- Repairs to Nunton playground equipment
- Internal maintenance/redecoration of Nunton Pavilion
- New picnic benches in Nunton Field, Odstock recreation ground, and Jubilee Gardens
- Boardwalk around the tree bordering the C12 opposite Odstock church
- Repairs to bus shelter at Odstock crossroads
- Repairs to bridge at Jubilee Gardens
- Explore options for a World War memorial bench

Road Hazards due to bushes and trees

The Parish Council is regularly asked to intervene in cases where the growth of trees and bushes bordering the highway is obstructing drivers' view of the road. This is particularly a problem at junctions and on bends, especially where the road is narrow. It is the responsibility of the landowner to keep any such trees and shrubs well cut back so that the re-growth does not obstruct visibility. Failure to do so is an offence under the Road Traffic Act 1980. Section 79 of the Act refers to 'Prevention of obstruction to view at corners' while Section 154 refers to growth which is 'a danger to roads or footpaths'. So if you have any hedges, trees or bushes on a road boundary please make sure that they are not a hazard to road users.

Cinderella at The Radnor Hall 22 to 24 November 2018



It was show time again with The Radnor Hall Players, and those of us fortunate enough to get tickets were in for a real treat - a full length pantomime played to a full house all three evenings, and with a tasty two course supper served in the interval.

Fifty two people drawn from all our five villages were involved in some way in this production. The cast numbered fifteen plus an extra three "Boys of the Old Brigade" dancers, the total appearing on stage therefore eighteen of whom as many as eight were teenage or quite a lot younger. The backstage team numbered eleven. Out front twenty three more people helped in the kitchen, bar, serving meals or selling raffle tickets. Altogether this made for a fine combined community venture and it was really great to see enthusiastic audience support from every local village.

The first thing to say about the performances is that it gave us all the greatest pleasure to see the young and not so young acting together so well and obviously enjoying it. The Cinderella story was well told, the action proceeding at pace with every actor projecting their voice clearly. The pantomime slapstick humour was much enjoyed, and we were treated to song and dance as well. And one could well appreciate the amount of imaginative work that had gone into stage scenery, sound production, building Cinderella's coach and other props, and general stage management.

I made a few observations about some of those taking part on stage;

Cinderella (Freya Allen aged 13) - exceptional performance as a maturing young woman and not just a downtrodden drudge, unfazed by the Prince.

Dandini (Paige Wilson aged 16) - very good performance as confidential Personal Assistant to the Prince rather than just a member of his court.

Children (aged 12 and under) - all delightful, boisterous, funny, switched on, and obviously having the time of their lives.

Prince Charming (Paula Gribben) - convincing as an elegant, agreeable, scientifically minded member of royalty.

Buttons (Stephanie Elcock) - experienced Radnor Hall Player, perhaps her best performance yet, key member of the cast, great appetite for lines.

Beryl and Cheryl (Maggie Metcalfe and Annabel Lawson) - unexpected and successful take on the traditional ugly sisters, outrageous, larger than life, somewhat overblown, fabulous costumes, might even be quite attractive to a brave man.

The Baroness (Elizabeth Stanger) - a veritable harridan.

Happy times and none of all this would have happened had it not been for the initiative, imagination, experience and dedication of our valued director Nick Stanger. Very many thanks, Nick, for giving us all such a fun evening. Now you have the growing talent - more of the same please in the coming year!

Church News

A reflection on Virtues

By Reverend Anna-Claar Thomasson-Rosingh

In the last three News and Notes my reflections have been around creativity, community and nature and how these areas open up space within us to relate in fresh and wholesome ways with ourselves and others. Another area that is traditionally seen as religious and fruitful for spirituality is around the values which we think are important. At home I have the *Family Virtues Guide** which is "sourced in the virtues which are common elements of spirituality found in all sacred traditions". Virtues are here seen as elements of spirituality. Examples include Compassion, Excellence, Generosity, Humility, Justice, Modesty, Love, Tolerance, Trust, Responsibility, and many more. Different traditions indeed and different households emphasise different virtues. For some determination, courage, assertiveness might be most important; for others caring, helpfulness and thankfulness are given priority. Alternatively you might consider obedience, orderliness and courtesy or joyfulness, enthusiasm and idealism. Schools now often work with virtues, and at Longford, creativity and hope are the virtues we have worked with this term.

In the Diocese the Bishop has asked us to concentrate on hope, prayerfulness, service and growth. One of the virtues that is close to my heart at the moment is 'respect', especially self respect and my respect for children. What impresses me time and again is how in the stories of the Christian faith God seems to be respecting people - for example in the greeting of the angel to Mary in the story of Christmas that is still fresh in our minds, or in the baptism of Jesus that we will be celebrating in the churches in January.

I wonder which virtues you think are really important and how do they help? Please feel free to contact me with questions or answers or prayers or something else.

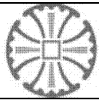

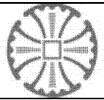
