Water

The last few weeks have been very wet. The rivers are full and in many places have burst their banks. Fortunately, we have the Salisbury flood meadows which are designed to act as reservoirs and prevent flooding. In December I published some photographs on the [News & Notes website](#) which showed how our rivers and fields were overflowing but managing well. There has been a wonderful sight in Bodenham of the swans moving off the river and onto the adjoining flooded field where they were able to feed in static water as opposed to the fast flowing Avon.

What a contrast to the landscape of Morocco, which we visited over the New Year. A beautiful country with mountains, desert and well cultivated fields but very dry in January. The rainy season has passed them by and the few crops we saw were struggling. The weather was dry and sunny, which is great for a holiday but not for the economy of their agriculture.

On our return to Gatwick we were greeted with driving rain which was bouncing off the roads. Our philosophical taxi driver, who was from Kashmir, had a view on oil and water; now that countries are becoming more self-sufficient on renewable energy or their own supply of oil, future conflicts are more likely to be based on water.

In September I was in northern Uganda, visiting the CRESS supported refugees from South Sudan who are living in very poor conditions in the refugee camps. Water is very scarce but critical to their wellbeing and their vegetables patches. The collection of it is the main feature of the day, with women often having to walk for hours to find a source of poor quality water.

So, whilst we are often happy to bemoan the weather, in particular the gales of mid-January, we live in an area where water is plentiful and safe to drink, the meadows and fields help to minimise the flooding of our homes, the wild life is able to adapt, but as you can read in the Longford Estate update, the fish farm has had challenges in keeping their fish inside the reservoirs rather than escaping into the Avon. Let us hope that the War of Water is still a long way off, and for now I am looking forward to the Spring and a drier landscape.

At Home

Lent is a good time to leave home and to reflect where our true homes are. Do we have any choice in the matter?

I wonder where you feel at home. What makes for a home, a good home? To what extent is home where you choose it to be, and to what extent is home something that is given to you by others?

“How lovely is your dwelling-place, O Lord of hosts! My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the Lord; my heart and my flesh sing for joy to the living God. Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God. Happy are those who live in your house, ever singing your praise.” Psalm 84: 1-4

Are we homesick for God’s house, as the psalmist is? I wonder whether Jesus’ time in the desert helped him to be more and more at home with God. The reverse is also true. In Jesus (and in his temptations) God comes home to us. So maybe the question is not: “Where are we at home?” Maybe the question is: “Whom can we be home for?” A choice we can make freely.

Longford Estate - Update

It would be fair to say that across the Estate we have been through 'hell and high water' in the past three months, particularly the latter! This autumn has seen an unprecedented amount of rainfall in the past few months and the number of wet days has caused problems not only here but across the country. We can of course be grateful that we are not experiencing the raging fires and heat of the Australian bush fires that are decimating large swathes of bush, rain forest, farmland and homes, any damage caused by our flooding is at least repairable.

The well made plans that we had set out for drilling our winter cereals were thrown out long ago as were the plans we made after that! The amount of rainfall and more frustratingly the number of wet days we have had made cultivations and getting seed in the ground extremely difficult. Our winter barley unfortunately never made it out of the seed bags, which leaves us in a predicament as to what we grow in its place, we are not the only farm in this position and spring crops will likely be grown in abundance across the country which will likely have a negative impact on their price. We have made positive strides on the wheat drilling with 60% of our planned area now drilled, albeit some of it in different fields to the original plan, this has been achieved through the determination and hard work of the arable team. The UK cereals market makes up about 1.8% of global production so whilst we may think we produce a lot of grain across the country we are price takers and not price makers. This has a real bearing when it comes to our cropping decisions, whatever they might be, and influences what we opt to grow if we are to be profitable.

Our cattle are out in the fields, as we do not have any cattle buildings, have had to endure the wrath of mother nature as well. With more of their winter ration already eaten due to the weather and some of our turnips failing to establish as well as we would hope, we made the decision to sell some cattle earlier than usual to ensure we have sufficient forage for the remaining winter months and before the herds go back onto the pastures in the spring.

Having had low flows in the rivers for most of the summer months, this has been completely reversed with both the Ebbles and the Avon having flooded out into The Park and water meadows prior to Christmas. The amount of water that has passed through the river channels has enabled them to be really scoured out and both rivers will benefit from this and this will enable wildlife to flourish. The Ebbles is running beautifully clear at the moment and is a great example of the type of habitat a chalk stream should be.

High water levels at a fish farm you might think would not be a problem, but in fact it is a real problem, flood defences had to be put in place to ensure fish remained in the correct ponds. More importantly, we had to ensure fish didn't escape into the main river leaving us without any fish! The new infrastructure works at the trout hatchery have progressed well despite pumps having to be installed to keep the ever-rising ground water out of the work site. This will provide a real boost to this business in terms of morale for our fish team as we are implementing new technologies, and in quantities and quality of fish being supplied to our growing sites.




