## Age of Anxiety?

When WH Auden called one of his poems 'The Age of Anxiety' it struck a chord. It became the title of countless other books, poems, articles - and a million car stickers. It's now a catchphrase for a whole cultural consciousness. It describes our chronic personal anxieties about illness, death, failure, and global anxieties about environmental catastrophe, pandemic, war, demise of democratic order.

Did anxiety ever exist before on this scale? Yes. Earlier eras too feared death, plagues, and barbarians at the gates. But anxiety now is massively amplified by mainstream and social media so we are more conscious of it. If anyone doubts this, think how saturated we have become with notions of 'safety'. This doesn't mean everyone now lives in a perpetual state of extreme anxiety, thankfully. But it can still ambush any of us, at some time.

How to deal with it? Not by denial and false assurances. There are real causes for anxiety, and we need to be realistic. But we need hope too. So we need *realistic* hope. A sense of proportion helps. We do have more resources now at least to mitigate some threats, which in the past were overwhelming. But that doesn't mean we can always just trust progress.

Neither history, experience, nor Christian faith, guarantee everything will always get better. Real hope draws on deeper perspectives from history and faith. When we ask Christian faith what we can realistically hope for there's no promise of automatic progress; but there *is* the promise that, whatever happens, God is working to bring good out of it. We are promised that whatever nature, chance, or our own efforts, throw into the melting pot of the future, another hidden actor is also always at work, redeeming the outcome - in this life and eternity. This is what resurrection means.

We cannot change all causes of anxiety. But we can always have realistic hope. Especially if we nourish it with human friendship, conversation, support. It is these ordinary but precious human activities which best sustain faith and hope. They are also exactly what Auden's poem presciently prescribed, long before covid's crippling restrictions. No wonder the prospect of more human contact will be so very welcome!

## **MENCAP**

#### The voice of learning disability

I am sure many of you have had your first vaccination by now with the second date firmly in the diary as the health professions work their way down the ages. For people with a learning disability, it is not such a simple wait for their age to dictate the date alone. It took the plight of Frances and the determined campaigning of her sister, Jo Wiley, to change the priority for everyone with a learning disability so that they can now get their vaccination regardless of age. The national charity Mencap had been campaigning from the outset but sometimes it takes one prominent "famous" voice to bring it to everyone's attention and make change happen.

As a local charity supporting people with learning disabilities, South Wilts Mencap, has continued the promotion of the importance of getting a vaccination to its members. The message simply is, if you have a learning disability, you should ensure that you are on the Learning Disability Register with your GP as it will highlight your need to have a vaccination now.

I have had the honour of working with this charity since 2013 and I can honestly say it has enriched both mine and my children's lives getting to know the members of our community whom the charity endeavours to support, enable and inspire to lead fuller lives. Set up 60 years ago by parents, it does use the national Mencap brand as an affiliated 'local group' but funds itself entirely with the sole purpose of providing social activities, holidays and clubs for those aged five right through to the later years in life.

Many of you, like myself before I started working with the charity, find it confusing to know exactly what is meant by the term learning disability. We hear so much about mental health now which is fantastic and long may that continue. However, this is an entirely different matter. Mencap put it best "a learning disability is a reduced intellectual ability and difficulty with everyday activities – for example household task, socialising or managing money – which affects someone for their whole life. People with a learning disability tend to take longer to learn and may need support to develop new skills, understand complicated information and interact with people."

My time with the Salisbury based charity has had many highlights over the years. We love nothing more than to party, so every year we hold one big one at Godolphin's Blackledge Theatre. It provides the perfect venue to dance with friends and enjoy a delicious buffet washed down with a cheeky drink (adults only of course). In the summer we get active with the help of Wiltshire Council's disability sports team and have a very competitive sports day at Sarum Academy. Throughout the year we have various social clubs that meet in the evening to enjoy activities with their peers and we all get jealous seeing photos from the holidays that our charity runs at home and abroad. Partying in Ibiza nightclubs is a popular choice as is banana boat riding in Corfu and mud baths in Turkey. For those who like it a little less wild, the Bluebell Line train or a trip to Butlins is on offer.

All this is possible because of the, some might say "unique" or "quirky", charity shop in Catherine Street. Whatever the opinion it has been run entirely by volunteers for nearly 40 years and makes up nearly all of the charity's income. The eclectic array of stock means there really is something for everyone and we have wonderfully loyal customers who I know can't wait for us to reopen (hopefully on 12 April if all goes well).

## **Nunton Farm**



We've all seen the tractors plodding to and from the dairy, looked on at the cows grazing peacefully in the pasture, and sampled the delights of Nunton Farm's creamy, fresh milk. But have you ever wondered exactly how many cows held up your daily commute? Considered when exactly to time your dog-walk so that you could catch a glimpse of milking time? Here's a little insight into the activities on Nunton Farm, a few facts and figures, and hopefully a few questions answered...

#### Women

Recently it was International Women's Day. So to kick it all off, I'd like to give a shout out to the women of Nunton Farm. I'm not sure if farming is still considered to be a male dominated industry, but it certainly isn't on Nunton Farm! We have five fantastic women on our farm: Charlotte, Beth, Tiny, Hazel and Liz work diligently, tirelessly and with huge devotion in all areas of farming, and we're proud to say they're part of the team.

#### Grass, grass, grass!

Nunton Farm spans 1200 acres of land. Of that, 940 acres is grass, 180 is maize, and 80 is lucerne (you may know it by its more popular name, alfalfa). The cows graze the 40 odd grass fields in a rotation system, grazing down one field before moving onto the next in the hope that the first field is fully replenished once they have rotated around the lot! Each week, we measure the grass in every field on the farm, this is known as 'walking the grass', and it's measured with a plate meter (affectionately know as 'the plonker' in the Martin household). The maize and lucerne is used to make silage for the winter months, when the grass struggles to grow quickly enough.

#### When are they milked? Why?

Cows are milked twice every day. The milkings need to be as far apart as possible in order to collect the most milk. Milking 12 hours apart would produce the greatest yield, but makes for a very long and antisocial working day; our cows are milked at 4am and 2pm (hint: that's when to time your dairy dog-walk folks!). Every day, twice a day, the cows walk from their grazing field to the dairy to be milked, and back again. If their current grazing field is dairy-side of the Odstock-Nunton road there's no commute interruptions, and if it's hospital-side then... well, you've all been there!

## How many cows?!

There are 800 milking cows on the farm, 200 calves, and another 200 cows offsite. The 200 offsite are just down the road on Uncle Edward's farm, at a sort of 'boarding school'. These are heifers (they've not yet had a calf) and so they can't be milked. They stay at Uncle Edward's boarding school until they are ready to come back to the farm and calve for the first time, at around two years old, after which they will join their pals in the herd.

#### **Daily stats:**

We have Friesian and Jersey cows, who will drink around 50litres of water each day (100 on a hot day!) and convert 20litres of that into milk, daily. That works out at around 12,000litres of milk produced by the farm each day. And every day, roughly 385litres of

this is sold through our three vending machines (about 900litres per machine, per week). We sell the rest through a contract, which used to be Wyke, who produce cheese, but is now Blackmoor Vale Dairy, who produce all sorts of dairy goodness, including cheese, kefir and yogurt.

#### **Future plans:**

We have loved the community spirit behind the vending machines, the fewer food miles and the idea of reusable glass bottles. We hope to supply our wider local community as we expand our vending machine enterprise and supply local shops with our delicious milk!






