"Rat Run" Traffic Speeding through our Community

Are you angry about the speed at which some drivers drive through our community?

If you are then why not join us in trying to do something about it? The members of the team volunteer for three or four hours a month working in groups of two or three, monitoring traffic speed using a speed camera provided by the Wiltshire Police.

We report cars found speeding to the Police and they either issue a warning or take enforcement action.

We usually station ourselves by the nursery in Odstock or in the middle of Nunton where we feel the risk of a speed related incident is greatest. Our presence is welcomed by parents dropping children off at the nursery and by residents in Nunton.

In line with Police policy we do not report drivers travelling at between 30 and 35mph nevertheless during a typical 45min session we expect to book and report 4 or 5 vehicles, a few travelling at speeds in excess of 50mph. We believe we make a difference and certainly notice vehicles braking sharply when we train the camera on them.

You may be aware that the Parish Council plans to install a Speed Indicator Device in the village. We welcome this as it will be on watch 24hrs a day but feel that it complements rather than replaces the work we do. No action can be taken against drivers picked up by the automatic camera on the device.

Unfortunately, because of ill health we have a depleted team and cannot do as much as we would like. If you are interested in joining us please contact me. All we ask is your enthusiasm to do something to improve our community and completion of a little on-line training provided by the Police.

Police and Crime Commissioner Update

Philip Wilkinson

A s your Police and Crime Commissioner, I appreciate that not everyone uses social media, so I have asked the many parish and village councils in the county if I can use your newsletters to let you know what is going on and what my office and the police are doing to keep you safe.

In my many meetings with our MPs, councillors and you, you have highlighted your concerns and set the priorities that myself and the Chief Constable will deliver in my Police and Crime Plan.

This plan, should it be endorsed in early March by the Police and Crime Panel, has been informed by you and what you have told me.

Your concerns relate to anti-social behaviour in all its guises; drug abuse and the violent crime that drug abuse drives; rural crime to include, fly-tipping poaching and hare coursing; speeding and road safety; on-line scams, child grooming and bullying; violence against women, girls, children and vulnerable people and burglary.

Your most prevalent complaint was that the police response to your concerns and complaints were rarely effective or timely.

The focus of my plan will not only be on crime prosecution but also early engagement, prevention and education and perhaps even more important victim and witness support.

I have been working with the Chief Constable and we will deploy the additional 62 officers the government has awarded us to counter those threats that you have prioritised.

Half of those additional officers will be deployed to counter those specific threats above and the remainder to boost your neighbourhood police teams in order to improve the response that you receive. More detail will follow with each of my briefs.

Our mission is to provide a safe haven for women and children who experience domestic abuse and support them in leading an independent life.

Salisbury Refuge provides accommodation for women and children fleeing domestic abuse including honour based violence, Female Genital Mutilation and Forced Marriage.

The refuge is a registered charity and we have a Board of Trustees who oversee and govern what we do. We have a team of staff including a Manager, Support Workers and a Play Worker in addition to a housekeeper, male handyman and administrator.

We have a large house on the outskirts of Salisbury accommodating up to 12 women and their children at any one time. Our accommodation is secure and staffed every day. Each family has their own room and share the other parts of the house.

We are partnered with Splitz Support Service, which works across the south-west of England to offer support to adults and young people experiencing domestic abuse or sexual violence.

Our specially trained staff use only the very latest best practice in every area of work that we do to ensure that we provide the very best service to survivors of domestic abuse. The refuge...

- Provides secure accommodation with the highest level of safeguarding and safety planning.
- Provides counselling and a tailored support package, as well empowerment and self esteem support.
- Provides advice and signposting for agencies and domestic abuse awareness.

THE ANNEXE

We want to make every person's stay with us as comfortable as possible. We understand how hard it is to leave your home, support network and belongings behind and we help as much as we can and thanks to the support of our local community, we have a small supply of food, clothing, toys and other essential items to help when families arrive.

We help with the little things such as helping to claim benefits, settling children into local school and nurseries and then help tailor a plan for you and your family to help you to reach your goals - to live

without fear of domestic abuse. We will also help you to get ready to live independently and help you to prepare for and plan your housing needs.

There are lots of things that we do to help and support you - we have a counsellor, play worker and we teach you about domestic abuse and how to recognise the signs. We support you to recover and empower you. While at the Refuge we will also work with you to manage your finances, plan your future with training or getting back to work.

"I was scared and nervous of what to expect. The staff are all kind and supportive and it's helped me loads. I can see a real change in myself since arriving."

"You have taught me how to become myself again and saved my life and provided me with a safe place to recover."

"You've stopped me from being killed, stopped me from being hurt again."

"I feel alive and free!"

All in the month of March

It was:

500 years ago, from 9 - 17 March, 1522 that Martin Luther preached his Sermons. He urged citizens to adhere to the core Christian values and trust in God, rather than using violence to bring about change.

175 years ago, on the 3rd, 1847 that Alexander Graham Bell, Scottish-born American engineer, and scientist, was born. Credited with inventing the first practical telephone.

150 years ago, on 16th, 1872 that the first FA Cup Final was held at the Oval in Kennington, London. Wanderers beat the Royal Engineers 1-0.

100 years ago, on 10th,1922 that Indian independence leader Mahatma Gandhi was arrested and charged with sedition for his campaign of non-cooperation against the British Indian government. He was sentenced to six years in prison but released after two years as he needed surgery.

80 years ago, on 8th, 1942 that the bombing of Essen, Germany, took place. It was the first attack on a German city by the British RAF following the Area Bombing Directive which authorised the bombing of civilian areas.

Also 80 years ago, on 25th, 1942 that Aretha Franklin, the Queen of Soul, was born. The American soul/R&B/pop/gospel singer was known for her many hit songs including Say a Little Prayer. (Died 2018)

75 years ago, on 1st, 1947 that the International Monetary Fund began operating.

70 years ago, on 11th, 1952 that Douglas Adams, British comedy writer and dramatist was born. Best known for Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy. (Died 2001)

65 years ago, on 25th, 1957 that the Treaty of Rome was signed, creating the European Economic Community (EEC) which came into force on the 1st, 1958. It was renamed the European Community in 1993 and dissolved in 2009, having been replaced by the European Union.

60 years ago, on 19th, 1962 that the American folk-rock singer Bob Dylan released his debut album Dylan.

50 years ago, on 24th, 1972 that the government of Northern Ireland resigned, and on 30th, 1972 that the British government introduced direct rule of Northern Ireland from Westminster (until 1999).

40 years ago, on 3rd, 1982 that the Barbican Centre in London was opened. It is the largest arts and conference venue in Europe.

30 years ago, on 19th, 1992 that Buckingham Palace announced the separation of the Duke and Duchess of York (Prince Andrew and Sarah Ferguson.)

25 years ago, on 6th, 1997 that Queen Elizabeth launched the official Royal website: <u>www.royal.gov.uk</u>

Also 25 years ago, on 21st, 1997 that the Rev WV Awdry, British clergyman and children's writer, died. Best known as the creator of the Tank Engine.

Context:

The people of Sudan must challenge themselves every single day, just to stay alive.

Babies sadly often die during childbirth and the maternal mortality rate in South Sudan is one of the highest in the world (2,054 per 100,000 live births). One in ten children dies before the age of five.

Preventable diseases such as malaria, diarrhoea and pneumonia are not always treated because of the lack of medicines.

The funds being raised for Sudan Medical Link will ensure the following:

a). Distribution of medicines and medical supplies three times a year to local clinics.

b). Provide primary healthcare kits, furnish and equip health clinics

c). Train local Sudanese people as clinical officers, nurses, midwives and laboratory assistants to work in their local communities.
