The Revolutionary Message of Easter

Like so many events, Easter seems to have been done and dusted in a flash. The chocolate eggs and cakes have been eaten, the yellow decorations stripped from shop windows and children return to school.

The festivals pass in an instant as we move on to the “next thing”. When is Ascension day and when will Pentecost occur? In our instant society of rapid response and communication there seems to be no room for lingering celebrations or of prolonging events.

The early church was different. The events of the first Easter made such an impact on the disciples that they took time to understand and respond to the news that Jesus had risen. That his life had not been a dramatic failure and that the shame of the cross had been replaced with triumph and hope. The empty tomb and the torn curtain in the temple were confirmation of the miraculous event. But still they spent many weeks both fearful about their safety (the doors were locked in the upper room when they gathered together) and full of joy when Jesus appeared to them several times; each time to teach them something new. The disciples clearly displayed a great mixture of emotions as they were told by Jesus to wait in Jerusalem for what was going to happen next and by our standards it was a long wait.

Sometimes I think we lose sight of the revolutionary message of Easter as we celebrate, pack away and carry on with our lives. We forget that Easter was both the end and the start of something even more remarkable, as the Gospel message swept through the known world carried by witnesses and followers of Christ. As we are tempted to lay Easter to one side and move on, so we forget that the death of Jesus was for us, now, in our generation, in our society. For if ever we need Christian values, guidance and hope, it is now.

So, as the church continues to celebrate Easter over the coming weeks, let us remember the example of the disciples of the Early Church, who waited, sought the way of Jesus and kept him in their thoughts and lives.

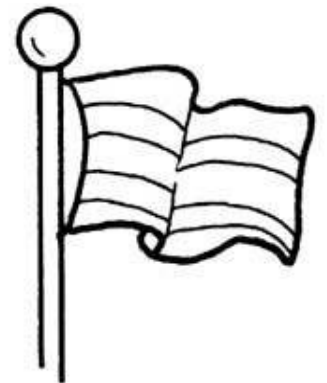

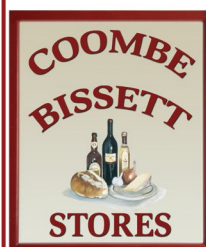

I don't envisage any of us would have thought that a war be happening again in Europe when I last wrote three months ago, the implications that this has for everyone regarding spiralling food and fuel costs was unimaginable. The rise in prices is a double-edged sword for the Estate as a whole with enterprises benefitting and suffering at the same time.

Two thirds of our spring cropping (barley and peas) area is drilled, linseed was drilled in the middle of April. We have dropped the poppies this year as the poppy seed is destined for the bakery market and with the cost of wheat rising the additional cost of poppy seed being added will be too much for some coupled with the fact that the price has not moved in line with other commodities making it uneconomical to grow.

Commodity prices are crazy with oilseed rape moving up in value by £25 in a single day on 4 April, feed wheat has surpassed £300/ton a price most would never have thought we would see. Whilst such prices are fantastic they are only half the equation, oil and gas prices have also soared, three months ago fertiliser was £635/t it hit £915/t in March!

The cows have started calving and we are expecting a good crop of calves this season. Two new bulls arrived in April in readiness for the bulls being put out with the cows in July.

The recirculation system on the fish farm exceeded two hundred tonnes of fish in its first year of operation which is an excellent result and this will increase next year as the biological filters are now established. Feed values for this enterprise have increased as agricultural commodities increase, and for the in-hand Estate it is this business that is closest to the customer as it deals directly with a number of supermarkets. Some supermarkets are suggesting that a 15% increase in food prices is not unrealistic because of rising costs. The cost to produce a kilo of fish has risen and we are having to justify our need to increase our prices on the back of feed, energy and labour costs to ensure our business is viable.

Our river fishery has remained busy all winter, the maintenance of the banks and grass cutting is now underway. The quality and size of the fish caught during the winter is a reflection of how we maintain and look after the watercourses across the Estate. The woods team had a busy winter with over 500 loads of logs having been cut and delivered between October and mid-March. The winter storms caused a lot of damage and the forestry team combined with our forestry contractors have a huge amount of work ahead of them this summer trying to deal with the aftermath along with all of the planned and routine forestry work that is required to nurture and maintain our woodlands.

The maintenance team remain busy, the winter storms added to their workload and required some jobs to be put on hold or pushed back to enable emergency repairs to be carried out.

We have continued to work with Bishops Wordsworth School. We now have an established walk with them whereby they bring a class from Year 8 each week to walk through part of the Estate, the walks incorporate various parts of the school curriculum and affords the students an opportunity to enjoy a day out in the countryside. We are planning in conjunction with the Parish Council a guided parish walk (numbers will be limited) to walk through part of the Estate that has no rights of way and to hear about some of the things we are doing as well as the challenges we face.

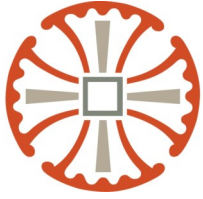

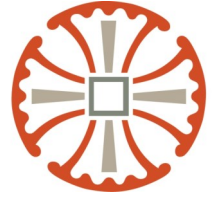

Salisbury Diocese News

A new Bishop for the Diocese of Salisbury

The Diocese of Salisbury are looking forward to welcoming their new Bishop.



The Rt Revd Stephen Lake was ordained and consecrated as a Bishop at Southwark Cathedral on 25 April and will be enthroned in Salisbury Cathedral on 19 June.

Bishop Stephen, who until recently was Dean of Gloucester, succeeds the Rt Revd Nicholas Holtam, who retired last July. He is the 79th Bishop of Salisbury.

Bishop Stephen, who grew up in Poole, trained for ministry at Chichester Theological College, held his curacy at Sherborne Abbey with Castleton and Lillington, and was ordained priest in 1989.

He became Vicar of St Aldhelm's, Branksome in 1992 and was appointed Rural Dean of Poole in 2000.

In 2001 he was appointed Sub Dean of St Albans and became Dean of Gloucester in 2011.

He said: "It is such a privilege and a joy to be called back to the Diocese of Salisbury as Bishop. To be able to serve in the places that formed me will be something rare and special."

Bishop Stephen is married to Carol and the couple have three adult children.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF HORATIO'S GARDEN AT LONGFORD CASTLE

Stunning private estate to welcome visitors this June in support of national charity Horatio's Garden

The charity's gorgeous, bespoke merchandise will be for sale too, alongside handcrafted goods created by volunteers, as well as plants grown in Horatio's Garden South West.

The event will be a unique opportunity for people to explore the beautiful gardens which are usually closed to the public, while also supporting the charity to celebrate its 10th anniversary.

Horatio's Garden South West was first opened in 2012, following a remarkable outpouring of love and goodwill in memory of Horatio Chapple. Horatio was a volunteer at the Duke of Cornwall Spinal Treatment Centre in Salisbury District Hospital when he first had the idea of creating a garden for patients with spinal injuries, who often spent many months in hospital with little to no access to the outside world. Tragically, Horatio was killed at the age of 17. His parents, Olivia and David, continued his fundraising efforts and have since gone on to establish Horatio's Garden as their son's thriving legacy.

In the ten years since the first garden opened, the charity has opened five more gardens, with its most recent garden – Horatio's Garden Wales – opening in April 2022. The charity's mission is to build a beautiful, therapeutic garden in each of the 11 NHS spinal injury centres in the UK and is currently fundraising for its seventh garden; Horatio's Garden Northern Ireland.

It was:

150 years ago, on 18th May 1872 that Bertrand Russell, Welsh philosopher, mathematician, historian, and writer was born. He won the 1950 Nobel Prize in Literature.

125 years ago, on 26th May 1897 that Bram Stoker's horror novel *Dracula* was published.

100 years ago, on 27th May 1922 that Christopher Lee, British film actor was born. Best known for his many Hammer Horror films, especially his role as Dracula. He also played a leading role in *The Lord of the Rings* and *The Hobbit*. (Died 2015)

90 years ago, on 9th May 1932 that London's Piccadilly Circus was lit with electrical lighting for the first time. The road junction later became famous for its neon lighting and video advertising displays.

60 years ago, on 25th May 1962 that the new Coventry Cathedral was consecrated. The previous one had been destroyed by German bombing during WWII.

50 years ago, on 28th May 1972 that Prince Edward, Duke of Windsor, died. He was formerly Edward VIII, until his abdication in December 1936.

40 years ago, 27th-28th May 1982 that the Battle of Goose Green took place during the Falklands War. British victory.

15 years ago, on 3rd May 2007 that three-year-old Madeleine McCann went missing while on holiday with her parents in Praia da Luz, Portugal. Despite long-running investigations costing millions of pounds, she has never been found. Her disappearance is the most-reported missing person case in history.

10 years ago, on 18th May 2012 that social media network Facebook went public. Its initial public offering raised \$16 billion – the third-largest amount in US history.

Context:

The people of Sudan must challenge themselves every single day, just to stay alive.

Babies sadly often die during childbirth and the maternal mortality rate in South Sudan is one of the highest in the world (2,054 per 100,000 live births). One in ten children dies before the age of five.

Preventable diseases such as malaria, diarrhoea and pneumonia are not always treated because of the lack of medicines.

The funds being raised for Sudan Medical Link will ensure the following:

- a). Distribution of medicines and medical supplies three times a year to local clinics.
- b). Provide primary healthcare kits, furnish and equip health clinics
- c). Train local Sudanese people as clinical officers, nurses, midwives and laboratory assistants to work in their local communities.
