In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee after 70 years of service.

The Platinum Jubilee Weekend takes place from 2nd to 5th June. Our villages are all doing something to celebrate. Thursday and Friday are both national 'thank' holidays.

On Thursday 2 June, more than 2000 beacons will be lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories, and one in each of the capital cities of Commonwealth countries in recognition of The Queen's long and selfless service. Our local Beacon, organised by Longford Estate, will be on the hills overlooking Nunton and Odstock and be lit at 9.45 pm, and visible from the villages.

On Friday 3 June, there are celebrations in Charlton All Saints; an all day event with activities for children in the morning, a Jazz afternoon and finally an evening of entertainment. Likewise, Britford is organising a village afternoon event on the Green, with fun stalls, a bar and teas.

Odstock with Nunton and Bodenham are celebrating with EbbleFest on Saturday 4 June on the Nunton Field with live bands, a medieval troop, bouncy castle, bottle tombola, tractor rides as well as food and bars.

EbbleFest will continue on Sunday with our annual Riverside service, the Duck and Raft race followed by a 'Street Party' lunch on Nunton field, which is open to everyone in all our villages to join in.

This is a very special weekend, and lots of people in the community have worked hard to organise these events. Full details of all these events are inside, as well as a What's On summary. See eN&N via the website for more colourful flyers.

You are very welcome at ALL these celebrations. After a couple of years of not being able to get together, let us all now meet up with our friends, new and old, and celebrate Her Majesty's wonderful achievement as a community.

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF HORATIO'S GARDEN AT LONGFORD CASTLE

Stunning private estate to welcome visitors this June in support of national charity Horatio's Garden

Longford Castle, the private ancestral seat of the Radnor family for over 300 years, built by Elizabeth I's chief lady-in-waiting, will be opening its spectacular gardens to the public on Sunday 19th June from 2pm – 5pm in support of national charity, Horatio's Garden.

The charity's patron, the Countess of Radnor, generously offered to host the event at her home in order to help the charity celebrate the 10 year anniversary of the opening of their first garden for patients with spinal injuries, Horatio's Garden South West at The Duke of Cornwall Spinal Treatment Centre in Salisbury. The event will raise vital funds to support their beautiful, accessible garden project in Salisbury, which offers a calm and comforting

accessible garden project in Salisbury, which offers a calm and comforting haven to support the physical and psychological rehabilitation of patients with spinal injuries, their families and the NHS staff who care for them.

Visitors will be invited to tour Longford Castle's private, stunning formal gardens whilst absorbing the remarkable architecture and atmosphere of this historic estate and may also explore the old garden alongside the River Avon.

Afternoon Tea (included in the ticket price) will be served throughout the afternoon, with the charity's volunteers making a delicious homemade bake alongside sandwiches, tea and scones. Guests will also be able to enjoy music by Hummingbird.

The charity's gorgeous, bespoke merchandise will be for sale too, alongside handcrafted goods created by volunteers, as well as plants grown in Horatio's Garden South West.

The event will be a unique opportunity for people to explore the beautiful gardens which are usually closed to the public, while also supporting the charity to celebrate its 10th anniversary.

Horatio's Garden South West was first opened in 2012, following a remarkable outpouring of love and goodwill in memory of Horatio Chapple. Horatio was a volunteer at the Duke of Cornwall Spinal Treatment Centre in Salisbury District Hospital when he first had the idea of creating a garden for patients with spinal injuries, who often spent many months in hospital with little to no access to the outside world. Tragically, Horatio was killed at the age of 17. His parents, Olivia and David, continued his fundraising efforts and have since gone on to establish Horatio's Garden as their son's thriving legacy.

In the ten years since the first garden opened, the charity has opened five more gardens, with its most recent garden – Horatio's Garden Wales – opening in April 2022. The charity's mission is to build a beautiful, therapeutic garden in each of the 11 NHS spinal injury centres in the UK and is currently fundraising for its seventh garden; Horatio's Garden Northern Ireland.

To ensure everyone's safety, pre-booking for the Horatio's Garden 10 Year Anniversary Garden Party at Longford Castle is essential. Tickets are available online now at www.horatiosgarden.org.uk/longford10. Accessible car parking will be free and unlimited. The majority of the garden is accessible to wheelchairs.

Broad Chalke Open Gardens Sunday 12 June



Six of Broad Chalke's most beautiful gardens will be on view from 1 – 5.30 pm on Sunday 12 June in a unique event to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee

This will be a rare opportunity to visit an interesting variety of private gardens within the Broad Chalke conservation area which are very rarely open to the public. They range from the extensive grounds of famous Reddish House - Cecil Beaton's former home (pictured); to the formal waterside gardens of medieval King's Old Rectory; and the pretty cottage garden of Anthony's Ground – a thatched house overlooking the water meadows of that name.

All six gardens are within easy walking distance of each another and a sketch map will be provided when visitors check in at the Village Hall from 12.30 onwards to buy their entry tickets for £5 a head. This price includes entry to all the gardens plus the village Jubilee exhibition and flower display in All Saints church opposite. Tea & home-baked cakes, plus toilet facilities will be available at the Hall, and there will be car parking around the village.

Proceeds of the day go towards the Wiltshire Community Foundation Welcome Fund for Ukrainian (and other) refugees, and towards Broad Chalke's church restoration project.

PCC Philip Wilkinson update

Increasing and improving the number ways my office, and Wiltshire Police, engage with communities is just one way to ensure Wiltshire has a police force which meets the needs of the people it serves.

We have to engage more with local communities and involve them in decision making, we simply have to excel at the basics. Slowly, this will have an impact and we will see an increase in our communities' trust that they are being heard and listened to.

Wiltshire Police is already making strides towards greater community engagement. We need to tell people who their local officers are as well as hearing when there has been great service or when there hasn't.

Making Wiltshire Safer has gone some way to bridge the gap between the police and the communities they serve. I believe it's not just about listening to those who shout the loudest, but also taking the time to meaningfully engage with those who feel they have limited influence.

This is where the Youth Commission plays such a crucial role, young people aged 14-25, are empowered to act as a critical friend to me and Wiltshire Police.

When it comes to young people we do find that, even with the best intentions, services and initiatives are provided for them, instead of with them and we risk alienating the very people we want to help.

We are now in the process of recruiting new members for the Youth Commission and I urge you to consider encouraging young people to apply.

I recognise there may be some sceptics who think this is lip service and won't result in tangible action or change. But that is not, and will never be, my leadership style.

My core responsibility is to represent Wiltshire and Swindon's residents when it comes to police and crime matters. This is not a responsibility that I take lightly or will shy away from.

▲ 250 years ago, on 22nd June 1772 that the Court of King's Bench ruled that slavery was illegal in England and Wales. But it remained legal in British Overseas Territories and colonies until 1833.

100 years ago, from 28th June 1922 to 24th May 1923, that the Irish Civil War took place. Led to Pro-Treaty leading to confirmation of the Irish Free State.

80 years ago, from 4th – 7th June 1942 that the Battle of Midway took place. The USA defeated Japan in the most important naval battle of the Pacific Campaign.

75 years ago, on 5th June 1947 that the Marshall Plan was proposed. US Secretary of State George C Marshall offered a self-help programme to Europe that would enable countries to rebuild democratic societies and resist communism after WWII.

65 years ago, on 1st June 1957 that the first premium bond prize draw took place in Britain.

Also 65 years ago, on 27th June 1957 that Britain's Medical Research Council reported that there was a cause-and-effect relationship between smoking and lung cancer.

50 years ago, on 17th June 1972 that the Watergate Scandal began when five men were arrested for breaking into the Democratic National Committee headquarters at the Watergate complex in Washington DC.

Also 25 years ago, on 26th June 1997 that J K Rowling's first Harry Potter novel, *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone* was published in the UK.

15 years ago, on 27th June 2007 that Gordon Brown became British Prime Minister.

Also 15 years ago, on 29th June 2007, that Apple released the first iPhone.

10 years ago, on 19th June 2012 that the founder of Wikileaks, Julian Assange, sought political asylum in the Ecuadorian Embassy in London, to avoid extradition to the USA after publishing classified documents. He remained in the embassy for seven years, until he was arrested and imprisoned.

10 years ago, on 24th June 2012, that Lonesome George, the male Pinta Island tortoise died. The last-known member of his species, Lonesome George serves as an important symbol for conservation efforts around the world, and particularly in the Galapagos Islands.
