NHS warns of scam Covid-test texts

The NHS is warning about widespread scam text messages telling recipients they have been in close contact with a Covid case. Close contacts of people who have tested positive

are no longer advised by the NHS to test.

You may receive a text message similar to the text box above. If clicked on, the link in the messages takes the recipient to a fake NHS page asking for personal and financial information. It looks very authentic.

In its alert, the NHS says it will "never ask for bank details, so please be aware of suspicious messages".




