# **Odstock Parish News**

## **Construction of new footway, Nunton**

The Local Highway Footway Improvement Group have identified that on some sections of the Odstock Road in Nunton there is a lack of footway provision. The forthcoming works are to construct approximately 150m length of new footway in the grass verge.

### What are the proposed improvements?

This scheme involves the construction of a new footway from the property Stoney Close to the agricultural buildings at Nunton Farm.

In addition, there will be a small extension to the existing footway with dropped kerbs just west of The Dairy to allow pedestrians to cross where the new footway ends and the existing footway continues on the north side of the carriageway.

### When will the works commence and how long will they take?

Construction work is programmed to start on Monday 5 September 2022 and is anticipated to take approximately five weeks to complete. During this time, a full road closure for motor vehicles and a diversion route will be in place for the duration of the works. A safe route for pedestrians and cyclists to travel through the road closure will be provided.

## **Odstock Parish Boundary Walk**

### Parish Boundary Walk - Sunday 25 September 2022

There will be an Odstock Parish Boundary Walk for the villagers of Odstock, Nunton and Bodenham (and their friends) on the 25 September commencing at the Pavilion in the Nunton Recreation Field at 10:30 am.

As well as walking on public footpaths, it will allow you to walk on private farm land and in the Longford Castle grounds, neither of which are normally open to the public. The walk will be in two parts. The first section of approximately 5.5 miles goes to Odstock, Britford, Longford Castle, Bodenham, towards Charlton, towards Clearbury Ring, The Dairy and back to the Pavilion. This will take about 2 hours. The second part will continue around Clearbury Ring, Great Yews, Homington Road, Odstock and finishing in the Radnor Arms for a well-earned cup of tea/coffee (or something stronger if you prefer). The complete walk will be about 14 miles and will take about 6 hours, including a stop for lunch.

Not only a community get-together, the walk is designed to show the extent of our Parish by 'beating the bounds'. If you intend to walk the entire boundary, please make sure you are well prepared for all weather conditions and are well 'shod'. Although beautiful, the downs are exposed and conditions underfoot may well be muddy and uneven in many places. This is not a sponsored walk. Parking is available in the Recreation Field if you need it. Please consult O.S. 1:50,000 or 1:25,000 Salisbury maps for the boundary route or e-mail for a route map.

# **Longford Estates**

On 2 July we hosted nearly 60 people for a farm walk. This was an opportunity for local residents, and a few from further afield, to see and hear about what we are doing on the farm and the wider Estate, it allowed us to explain why we do some things in certain ways and for us to be asked questions about our operations and thoughts for the future. It was a really good morning with young and more senior joining us.

This time last year we saw wildfires across Europe due to a heat wave, this year we along with central Europe have experienced another heatwave. To date there have been 745 wildfires in the UK up from 247 for the whole of 2021, it may be something we become more familiar with as a result of climatic changes. Unfortunately, we had a relatively small fire this year in a stubble field which was quickly brought under control whilst there was no damage to buildings or crops it was frightening the speed at which it travelled across the field in the tinder box conditions.

The heatwave has had some benefits on the farm as we have been able to combine everything with exception of the linseed in 24 days and it has all been dry. Early on we had the problem of the oilseed rape being too dry and as such had to be cut during the night when the air was damper to raise the moisture level of the grain! We invested in a new John Deere X9 Combine this year which cuts 12 metres (40 feet) at a time. The superior threshing ability allowed us to travel faster which all helped in a successful harvest. John Deere came to film the combine working, have a look at tinyurl.com/LongfordEstate

The cows calved in 8.6 weeks this year which is a record and creates a much more uniform group of animals for us to select breeding replacements from as well as selling for fattening. The bulls went in with the cows on 1 July, for nine weeks, unfortunately three went badly lame in the first three weeks meaning we had to purchase a new bull and move others around to ensure all of the cows are served in a timely manner. The dry weather in late June & early July allowed us to make a good crop of hay for the winter but the heatwave has meant the pastures have died off and winter forage is already having to be fed. Turnips have been planted for winter grazing but until we get some rain they won't germinate which is a concern for the winter months.

Water is critical to a fish farming business and the low river levels add pressure to this business as the fish require a given level of water flow to grow. The River Analysis System is immune to river levels but not water temperature and the heatwave has meant water temperatures in both our river systems have been higher than we would like.

The low rivers flow has not stopped our fishing syndicate enjoying some good fishing but they have had to choose the right day and time of day to be successful. The brown trout we stocked in the river have provided some good sport and importantly there have been some excellent large wild brown trout caught as well. The carp we are growing for our carp project are growing really well and there will be some great fish to catch in years to come.

The woods team have been doing their summer routine work of tending to the young plantations alongside dealing with the remnants of storm Eunice and Ash dieback which is going to be a long-term problem across the UK.

#### CONSTRUCTION OF NEW FOOTWAY - C12 ODSTOCK ROAD, NUNTON

#### BACKGROUND

It has been identified through the Local Highway Footway Improvement Group, formally known as the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) that on some sections of the C12, Odstock Road in Nunton there is a lack of footway provision. The forthcoming works are to construct approximately 150m length of new footway in the grass verge.

#### WHAT ARE THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS?

This scheme involves the construction of a new footway from property Stoney Close to the agricultural buildings at Nunton Farm.

In addition, there will be a small extension to the existing footway with dropped kerbs just west of The Dairy to allow pedestrians to cross where the new footway ends and the existing footway continues on the north side of the carriageway.

#### WHEN WILL THE WORKS COMMENCE AND HOW LONG WILL THEY TAKE?

Construction work is programmed to commence on <u>Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2022</u> and anticipated to take approximately five weeks to complete. During this time, a full road closure for motor vehicles and a diversion route will be in place for the duration of the works as shown on the plan overleaf. A safe route for pedestrians and cyclists to travel through the road closure will be provided.

Unfortunately, the bus routes will be affected by the road closure, the amendments to routes is outlined below.

Public Bus 44 - Will not be able to call at Odstock, but will pick up passengers at Nunton (next to Springfield House) which is where the bus will turn around. Bus users from Odstock can use bus service 29 instead.

School Bus to Trafalgar School - will pick up at Odstock Cross Roads, then run via Rowbarrow and Britford to Nunton, where it will pick up next to Springfield House which is where the bus will turn around.

Afternoon School Bus 29A from Salisbury Grammar School - will not call at Nunton (students from Nunton should travel home on bus 44 from the City Centre at 4.15pm).

School Bus to Longford School - This school mini bus will be specially allowed through the road closure, so will run as normal.

### **#BringAPicnicNotABBQ**

If British Summer Time and warmer days means you will be visiting one of Dorset & Wiltshire's local heathlands or outdoors spaces to enjoy the wildlife and wilderness, please take a picnic.

Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service (DWFRS) are encouraging residents and visitors to take a picnic and not BBQ. Warmer and breezy weather increases the risk of accidental or deliberate fires in our open spaces. A wildfire can move at speeds faster than an Olympic sprinter, so we are asking people who are out and about to follow some simple steps:

If you are enjoying our open spaces when a fire occurs, get to a safe place and call 999 with as much information as possible.

Consider downloading and using What3Words to identify your exact location.

You can also help by reporting any antisocial behaviour on the heath to the Police on 101.

During 2021, DWFRS dealt with 494 fires in the open. In 2022, we have already seen large wildfires in Dorset & Wiltshire and firefighters across the UK have dealt with more wildfires between January and May than in the whole of 2021 (243 compared to 237 in 2021).

Anyone caught starting a fire on a heath will be prosecuted whether it is a case of deliberate arson or neglect, for example an unauthorised camp fire or a disposable BBQ that gets out of control. Wildfires cost lives not only to endangered plants and animals but also put people and houses in danger.
