Odstock, Nunton and Bodenham WI Report

September 2022

The president welcomed approximately 40 members and a guest. She thanked volunteers for preparing the hall, and for the vibrant sunflowers.

A sombre minute's silence in memory of Queen Elizabeth II was held, followed by three cheers for King Charles III.

Reports were given on outings to Bucklers Hard, Southampton Sea City Museum and Sir Harold Hillier's Gardens near Romsey, all of which were much enjoyed.

Members were informed of group and county events and invited to sign up for the Autumn lunch, 'Much Ado About Nothing' at Salisbury Playhouse, and Christmas events.

After coffee, Clare Kent from Wessex Archaeology gave a fascinating talk about local archaeological investigations which must take place before development. Clare described how to discover local ancient history using the internet and old tithe maps, and techniques such as LiDAR cameras which shows data beneath the soil, to help archaeologists plan appropriate trenches to investigate further.

It was intriguing to hear of information gathered recently from the Woodbury iron-age site near Salisbury District Hospital. Here a group of small round huts from the bronze age were found below the iron age fort settlement, showing that humans have occupied the area for over 4000 years.

The speaker was warmly thanked, leaving members keen to discover more about local history, and the meeting was closed with a reminder of a sale at the November meeting. The next meeting on 10 October includes a talk by Ann Orr on Wills and Powers of Attorney, followed by our Autumn Lunch.

CRESS Update

CRESS FUNDED CLINIC IN NORTHERN UGANDA

Northern Uganda is one of the remaining pockets of global systemic poverty. Most of the community in which we work live under the \$2 a day mark and lack basic infrastructure and resources. That is why it is nearly impossible for the Ugandan government to address the basic needs of the 1.4 million South Sudanese refugees who have fled to the area and why CRESS has stepped in by opening and operating a Primary Health Care Clinic in Mjale, N Uganda, which in 2021 saw over 12,000 patients and over 200 births.

It provides treatment for malaria, pneumonia, diarrhoea, diabetes, hypertension, typhoid, brucellosis and other skin conditions. In addition, the clinic also provides vital pre and post-natal care. The CRESS clinic provides the most advanced services in a 3 hour radius and is the only urgent care option. The clinic works alongside the nearest government health centre to provide more advanced care.

WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE CLINIC

Field Midwife



The clinic has appointed a new field midwife Nsimenta Asaba who joined the clinic team in May. Asaba is dividing her time between the Mijale Clinic maternity work helping the midwife Bethy, who delivered 218 babies single-handedly in 2021, and also work in the refugee camps where there is no maternal health support.

In the camps she has already begun teaching about hygiene, family spacing, correct use of a mosquito net and maternity classes. As well as helping deliver some babies.

Eye Surgery



In June, eye screening was carried out by eye doctors from Arua hospital, who travelled out to Mijale, some 100 kilometres away. They screened 234 patients. 43 patients were recommended to have glasses and others were seen with trachoma, allergies, degenerative diseases and glaucoma. Surgery was undertaken in July on 63 cataracts and 4 eye lids. The glasses were also given to their owners over the summer.

Roba's Story

"My first eye problems started in March 2021, My eyes were both affected, it hurts so much. The two eyes were not seeing completely. They have to move me with a guiding hand. It was so challenging. I struggled a lot.

When I received the news about the eye project for the Diocese of Liwolo, I was so excited and asked my people to take me to Mijale for the screening, which was done. And now, after the first operation of the right eye, I can see again, and I am so grateful.......After the operation of the second eye, I could not wait for the next day for the cotton to be removed, the following morning, about 9am, when the cotton was removed, I was so glad when both of my eyes could see."

Update on our new Team Vicar

On Wednesday 28 September, our new Team Vicar for The Chalke Valley Benefice was licensed by The Rt Revd Dr Andrew Rumsey, Bishop of Ramsbury in the church of St Michael and All Angels, Coombe Bissett.

The Reverend Dr Ruth Howlett-Shipley grew up in Mansfield in Nottinghamshire before moving to London to study Medicine at University College, London. Following her early medical career, in which she practised as an Obstetrician and Gynaecologist and a General Practitioner, she became a Consultant in Public Health and Communicable Disease Control, working initially for NHS Dorset as Deputy Director of Public Health and later as Public Health Consultant to the Royal Navy and Defence Medical Services.

On hearing and responding to God's call to Ordained ministry she studied initially at Sarum College and then on the Portsmouth Pathway at Ripon College, Cuddesdon.

Ruth was ordained Deacon by the Rt Revd Christopher Foster in Portsmouth Cathedral in June 2019 and in 2020 was ordained Priest. She served her curacy in the United Benefice of Shedfield and Wickham in Portsmouth Diocese and is very excited to start her ministry in the Chalke Valley Benefice and the Diocese of Salisbury.

Mrs Enid Hollingshurst 1938 – 2022

The Reverend Robert Hollingshurst was Priest-in-charge of Nunton, Odstock, Bodenham, Britford and Charlton-All-Saints from 1984 – 1997.

He and his wife Enid, and four children, Chris, Steve, Liz and Daniel were the first occupants of Nunton Rectory. Enid died peacefully in mid-September 2022, a few days after her 84th birthday. She contracted Sepsis shortly after her 80th birthday, which rendered her bed-bound with daily carer visits to her home at the Church of England-owned Manormead Supported Housing retirement complex in Hindhead, Surrey.

There she welcomed frequent visitors and kept in touch regularly with friends further-afield by letter and by phone.

Enid was the local Nunton, Odstock, Bodenham, Britford and Charlton Christian Aid co-ordinator for many years and worked as a supply teacher in the area, particularly at the Ward Teaching Unit at Salisbury District Hospital.

She was a keen gardener and supported her husband Robert in his ministry and parochial work throughout their time in the parish. Enid's ashes will be interred alongside Robert's (who died in November 2009) at Little Gaddesden Church, near Hemel Hempstead, which was their last parish before they retired to Seaford, on the East Sussex coast. Enid's funeral will be held in Hindhead on Thursday 6th October 2022.

PCC Philip Wilkinson update

I have now been 'in the job' of PCC for a year, and if there is one thing that's been made abundantly clear to me, it's that your confidence in policing is not where I want it to be.

Whilst there are clearly some exceptional individual officers, overall, there have been gaps in the service you receive. In the past year, I have made practical steps to address them, such as the purchasing of effective technology such as drones and ensuring more officers are deployed to the rural crime team.

The damage done by crimes such as hare coursing, criminal damage and theft have a massive impact on the rural community and history shows that at times of recession, farms become targets.

I regularly speak to farmers and I'm all too aware of the reasons why you feel that reporting crime is not worthwhile. In my Police and Crime Plan, I've committed to ensure Wiltshire Police takes these crimes seriously and deals with them effectively.

This is why I've taken steps to ensure the rural crime team has the capabilities and staffing it needs.


As part of this commitment, Wiltshire Police has introduced online crime reporting specifically for rural crime. The form takes about ten minutes and is picked up by the same people who answer 101 calls.

It's vital that to build up an overall picture and identify patterns of criminal activity, all crime is reported, no matter how small it may seem.

As this has only recently been introduced, I welcome your feedback about how the system is working. It's only through working together that we can stop these crimes from happening and make Wiltshire a safer place to live and work.


