

Following the break the visiting speaker, Charlotte Mortimer, gave a serious and fascinating talk on the vital work of the Wiltshire Air Ambulance team, and the importance of funding this 'mini hospital in the air' charity. We learnt that the Air Ambulance receives no public funds and costs over £3 million a year to run. As well as maintaining the Bell 429 helicopter [look for the logo 'GWilts' on its underbelly], there is a dedicated team of highly qualified paramedics and pilots to support, plus administrative staff. Charlotte explained that building is under way for a purpose-built base for the Air Ambulance at Semley near Melksham. From here all of Wiltshire can be accessed in less than 11 minutes for saving lives. Gill Dodd thanked Charlotte on behalf of those assembled, and a donation was made.

2 tbsp flour

Salt and pepper

- 2 Ox cheeks (approx. 1 kg) trimmed, each cut into 4 equal pieces.
- 4 tbsp olive oil
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 1 stick celery, sliced

3 cloves of garlic, finely chopped

4 medium carrots, cut into chunks about 4cm long

4 sprigs of thyme, leaved only

1 bay leaf

1x5cm strip of orange peel

750ml red wine

1tbsp runny honey (optional)

Method

Heat the oven to 140°c/gas mark 1. Season the flour with the salt & pepper and put in a plastic bag. Add the bits of ox cheek and toss well until the meat is lightly coated, shaking of excess as you take it out.

Heat the oil in a heavy-based casserole on the hob. Add the meat in batches and cook over a high flame for 2 minutes each side, turning the pieces until they are browned all over. As each batch is done, scoop it out and put it in a bowl.

When you've removed the last batch, stir the onion, celery and garlic into the oil in the pan. Turn down the heat a little and let the vegetables soften for 4-5 minutes. Next, add the carrots, herbs and orange peel and toss everything together, then pour in the wine, scraping any crusty bits from the bottom of the pan. Add the meat and any juices from the bowl, then bring the whole lot to a gentle simmer.

Cut a circle of greaseproof paper or baking parchment to roughly the same size as the dish, then press it down over the surface of the stew –it will help keep the meat and veg submerged while they cook. Put the lid on the dish and place in the oven Cook for 2-3 hours until tender

Longford's Waterways and Fishing

Longford has the advantage of having the most fantastic yet complex system of waterways I know of any rural estate. The Avon Valley has such a rich diversity and is crisscrossed by an extensive water management system developed by man's intervention.

The two main feeders of the valley that flow through the Estate are of course the River Avon and its tributary the Ebble, the confluence of which is just south of Longford Park.

These two arteries provide a resource rich in indigenous fish species but also "riparian habitat" whereby flora, fauna and invertebrate life is abundant, creating a fantastic wildlife corridor. The Estate holds such a buffer in the highest conservation regard with the aim of protection where possible.

Habitat needs to be managed and enhanced and our able River Keeper, Peter Orchard, oversees this huge task.

There are however threats via diffuse pollution, nitrates and the significant effect that abstraction now plays which changes the ecology of the river hugely.

Adjacent to the River are the traditional water meadows. The first were developed as early as the 16th Century when there was a desire for those that worked the land to introduce water to low lying areas so that a thin layer of water was spread over the grass sward. This in turn encouraged early growth providing a first "bite" for livestock given that water raises soil temperatures by 5⁰C promoting germination which gave the livestock, mainly sheep, the nutrition required in early spring which more latterly is enjoyed by cattle.

The water meadow systems continue to be controlled and irrigated using channels, sluices and hatches and this to a more or less degree continues today. These carriers also form a vital safe haven for spawning fish and therefore again a managed habitat is vital.

The Avon has the most amazing number of fish species; there is a run of Atlantic Salmon and we have recently nurtured the passage to their spawning grounds by the installation of a fish ladder with a second to be installed this summer.

There is a run of Sea Trout, Wild Brown Trout and Grayling as well as coarse fish which includes the famous Avon Roach, Chub, Dace, Carp and Barbel to name a few.

We have an angling syndicate, however we are very careful not to commercialise this entity too much as we wish to retain the feeling of a wild fishery.


