In a couple of weeks the majority of the working age clergy in our Diocese of Salisbury will be travelling to Derbyshire for our Conference. Both Catherine and I are going. It is something that happens every 3 years and it is either seized upon with enthusiasm or dread until we all arrive and then we settle down to the case in hand. This year our Conference is entitled Faith in an Age of Uncertainty - a title chosen long ago but it certainly fits the moment. Those dreadful acts of terrorism in Manchester and London; the Grenfell Tower fire; alongside all the political uncertainties in our country and the apparent polarisation of our British society, all make for very uncertain and difficult times.

We don't like uncertainty. That is why so many of us feel shaken and unsettled - let down perhaps and certainly there is real anger around. We try to make smart choices to manage the uncertainties of life as best we can. We try to live healthy lives, get a good education and smooth out the ups and downs through financial planning for ourselves and families as well as for our communities, but there is always uncertainty.

Bishop Nicholas has written this month that "Religious faith helps us navigate the changes and chances of this life, to be creative, good and loving amidst whatever the difficulties". Just think about the way people responded to the terrorism in Manchester and London, or the fire in Kensington. We are made for goodness and goodness is stronger than evil, love is stronger than hate. In the end, the way of truth and love wins every time.

Christianity has always been one generation from extinction but that is a good reason for us to be confident. It is an enduring faith. Indeed, perhaps having to work hard for what matters is what draws out the best from us.

Not many of us are asked literally to give our lives for our faith but more than ever during the coming weeks we need to give ourselves to each other, we need to be the rock of hope for others who are frightened, unsettled and angry. What the disciples knew and what we need to take away from this service today is that if we only seek to look after ourselves we will be sunk. But if we walk the way of the Cross, if we love one another, if we give generously and are thankful, if we seek the way of truth and peace, then we will have life in all its fullness.

The Parish Council met on Monday 22 May in the Pavilion in Nunton Field. We had a full agenda, and these are some of the main topics of discussion:

Dog waste bins

Several local residents have asked for dog waste bins to be installed in the village recreation fields. We have looked into the options, and it is clear that having the bins emptied by a commercial contractor is simply too expensive. If the proposal were to go ahead we would therefore need a group of volunteers who are willing to take on responsibility for emptying the bins regularly. If sufficient people come forward we will install suitable bins on a trial basis.

Decommissioning of Telephone box in Odstock

The telephone box next to The Yew Tree Inn at Odstock has now formally been decommissioned, and ownership has transferred to the PC. We now need to decide what the box will be used for in future.

The results of the parish questionnaire survey carried out last year included a suggestion to turn the phone box into a book exchange similar to the one in Charlton All Saints. Before reaching a final decision we would like to hear your views on this proposal and any other ideas you may have.

Nunton Field

Some of the window frames in the Pavilion in Nunton Field are falling apart, and the PC has decided to have all the windows and some doors replaced this summer. We hope that this work will be completed in time for the ONB Fete in July.

Our community speedwatch team is now up and running, and you may have seen members of the team in their high visibility jackets. If you would be willing to give up a few hours to take part please contact Nigel Start.

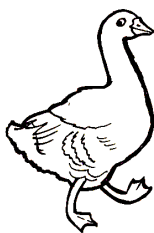

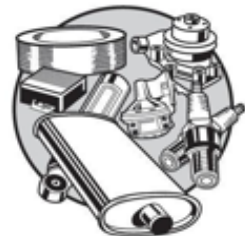
