Touchstones of Spirituality 2

Last month I did not explain the title of my 'thought for the month'. I ought to do so. There are (according to research) five areas of human life that are fruitful for spirituality: they are known as the *touchstones of spirituality*. Whether you believe in (a or more) g/God (s) or not, these are areas where most people can experience something more or other than themselves; where there is energy, inspiration or even ecstasy. As a Christian I would say these are "thin places" where we meet God. The five areas are:

Creativity: music, art, cooking, making, inventing, designing and a lot of other things.

Community: when people meet together and feel they belong.

Nature: relationship with the natural world in gardens, pets, walks and 100 other ways.

Faith: this is your worldview even if it is not religious and does not include god. For example as a Christian I think that we can get to know what God is like by looking at Jesus.

Practice: it can be religious practice like going to church at Christmas. It can also be moral practice in what values you think are important (patience, courage or faithfulness) and how you think we should treat each other.

As I am getting to know people here and meet and walk and talk with you these are the areas of life I am interested in. Looking forward to meet and talk more.

Creativity

In this reflection I would like to explore one of the touchstones of spirituality: creativity.

In the two biblical stories about God creating the world there are some interesting scenes. One is from the first story. God says: "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness". (Genesis 1:26) I wonder in what way the ancient story writer thought that humans were like God. As it is right at the beginning the only thing we have really seen of God is creativity. Could that be the great likeness between ourselves and the divine: creativity.

The other is from the second story. "God formed 'man' (Adam) from the 'dust of the ground' (adamah) and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life" (Genesis 2:7). The picture is of God making things out of the soil and breathing his creativity into humanity.

That is how as Christians we understand our nearness to God when we are creative. Inspiration and energy are released as we make and build; write and think; photograph and paint; play and sing. We become more open to ourselves and to others.


