### Fairness and Fund-raising

In the March edition of News and Notes, I asked for some advice about my approach to games of Scrabble with my mother. I am grateful to those who expressed a view, particularly the lady who said I should keep winning because my mother would be proud of me. After my last visit to see her, I realised that my mother might solve the problem for me herself because she seems to be getting better at Scrabble all the time and our scores get closer with each game!

I have another problem now, although this time, you'll probably be pleased to hear, I'm not seeking advice from readers. On 5<sup>th</sup> May, I have the opportunity to express my preference as to which of two systems is used for the future election of our members of parliament. As I read all the comment on the subject, particularly the letters to the editors of various newspapers, my voting intention varies. What seems like a very good argument for a Yes vote is followed by what appears to be an equally good defence of a No vote. I'm not finding the sometimes negative aspect of the lobbying campaigns particularly helpful either.

My problem is in trying fully to understand the implications of each choice. Clearly, a change would make some difference but to me it's not self evident that it would be for the better. Neither am I convinced that the ill-named First Past The Post system more accurately reflects the combined will of the people than the Alternative Vote.

We're seeking a method which is as "fair" as it can be for all those involved, voters and candidates alike. I often find the concept of fairness a difficult one and that is certainly the case in this instance. I wish us all luck as we make our choice.

Talking of fairness, how good it is to see all the efforts being made by those around us to make life a bit fairer for those who need some help! There are quite a number of articles on the forthcoming pages giving evidence of fund-raising activities that have already taken place or soon will. Congratulations to all those involved.

### Borrow a free energy monitor

All Wiltshire council-run libraries, including mobile libraries, are lending free energy monitors to householders to help them keep an eye on their electricity use.

From Monday, April 4 the energy monitors will be available to borrow from libraries for up to three weeks at a time.

The device is easy to operate and shows how much energy is being used in people's homes. It instantly shows the cost of switching on a light, turning on the TV or boiling a kettle.

Each monitor will be loaned with a booklet containing instructions, energy saving advice and information about grants, funding and useful contacts. Energy experts from the council will also be providing information at a number of advice events at libraries throughout April.

The scheme is organised by Wiltshire Council with funding from a government grant. It aims to help people cut their energy consumption by taking simple measures like replacing old light bulbs with energy efficient ones, or not leaving appliances on standby.

Chairman of the climate change board, Cllr Toby Sturgis, said: "It is great we are able to lend these energy monitors from our libraries. Understanding how energy is used in the home can help improve energy efficiency and reduce energy bills by as much as 15 percent in the first year. I would encourage anyone who wants to reduce their energy costs to borrow one of these."

There are 200 monitors available to loan through the scheme. For more information call 01225 713727.
