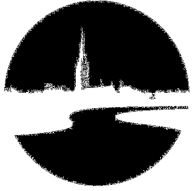

Mercy Ships

What is it about me and ships? Many of you know that Sherwood and I spend a lot of time on the Jubilee Sailing Trust's ships, Lord Nelson and Tenacious, but this time I am doing something a little different.

I am volunteering my anaesthetic skills to work for two weeks on the Africa Mercy, a hospital ship, in Congo Brazzaville. It has been one of my long term ambitions to work on this ship, ever since I read articles by Dr Keith Thompson, an anaesthetist from Basingstoke who regularly donates time to work with them. Now that I am no longer working on a regular contract, I have both the time and the skills to volunteer with the charity. The ship itself will be stationary, thankfully. The thought of coping with seasickness as well as anaesthetising is too much to be considered!

The charity has been in existence for more than 30 years and by using ships as hospitals, they have been able to supply healthcare to many needy areas in the world. They take volunteers from all over the world, for all types of work in running the ship - from the hospital wards to the engine rooms, the school to the kitchen, everyone on board is a volunteer.

Broadband is coming..or not! (cont)

In the August edition of News and Notes I wrote an article about the provision of broadband for the Odstock, Nunton, Bodenham area. I described the economics of provision of faster communications (laying fibre optic cable) and showed how any company – be it BT or another private enterprise – has to make a worthwhile return on the investment of laying cable. Small, strung-out communities like ours are unlikely to represent sufficient numbers of subscribers to make the investment profitable unless there is concerted pressure from the residents. Hence, we are pretty low down the list of any provider's priorities.

Since my article I can update you as follows:

First, I invited people to contact me to express an interest in taking this to the next stage – which would be to prepare a more detailed questionnaire about our needs. Sadly I have had only twelve responses which doesn't bode well for drumming up pressure for a case to suppliers. I am grateful to those who have replied (and to a few who have spoken to me in person) but this clearly is insufficient to warrant further work.

Second, I had a very helpful exchange of emails with Gigaclear – the company currently attempting to get fast broadband into the Farley, Pitton and Firsdawn area. They expressed some doubt as to whether our area would ever be a likely target for them. Furthermore, they told me that they are having some difficulty with the Farley project because it would appear that BT have entered the fray at the last minute with proposals to put a new exchange in the Alderbury area..... *(Alan's article continues here with more information about BT's approach to this issue. If you'd like to read the whole piece, I've made it available from the News and Notes Homepage, beneath the link mentioned below.)*

Third, as one reader of News and Notes helpfully pointed out, there is a web site where one can register an interest in getting faster broadband from BT Openreach and I would encourage everyone to sign up for that. The link to the web page is clearly provided on the News and Notes home page at <http://www.newsandnotes.co.uk/>.

I would love to have had a more positive story to tell and to be able to go on to the next stage by preparing a questionnaire. Unfortunately I have to draw a line under this and hope that the march of progress doesn't completely pass us by!
